



## BOARD HIGHLIGHTS October 26, 2022, Regular Meeting St-Isidore, AB

### REGISTRATIONS 2022-2023

As of September 30, 433 students were enrolled in kindergarten to Grade 12. This represents a slight increase (1.6%) in the number of students in our schools.

Our pre-kindergarten (PRÉMATERNELLE) programs have 61 children enrolled, compared to 43 last year.

### STRATEGIC PLANNING

A new strategic planning process is underway that will continue until November 2023 and culminate in a new 2024-2029 strategic framework. The process includes reviewing the Board's vision, mission, values, strategic directions and priorities.

### SCHOOL COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT

The trustees received the school councils 2021-2022 annual reports.

### MEETING WITH SCHOOL COUNCILS

The Board again invites school councils to a day of collaboration. The proposed date and program will be confirmed in consultation with school councils.

In addition, trustees commit to continue attending school council meetings throughout the year.

### ASSURANCE FRAMEWORK

An Assurance Framework surveys report was presented. The report summarizes some of the strengths and challenges based on outcomes for the 2021-2022 school year. This data will be analyzed and presented in the 2021-2022 AERR.

### 2022 FNCSF ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The CSNO was represented at the annual conference on October 21-22, 2022 in Whitehorse, by Sylvianne Maisonneuve, Pascal Leclerc and Mario Paradis, school trustees, as well as Superintendent, Brigitte Kropielnicki. Attendees appreciated the pre-conference, as well as the regular program; highlighting the relevance of speakers and presentations.

During the conference, various awards were presented. The CSNO congratulates École Heritage graduate [Isabelle Nicolet-Thibault, who received one of the RNDGÉ Perseverance Bursaries](#), and CSNO School Trustee Mario Paradis, who was recognized by the FNCSF for more than 15 years of service as a Francophone Trustee.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

**Student Services** - An agreement has been reached with a Grande Prairie consultant to support our teachers with students on the autism spectrum. This service is offered in English, but it is necessary so that our students and their parents can access programming that meets their needs. This is complementary to the services offered by CSNO's new Student Well-Being Worker.

**FPFA Symposium** - This year, mini-seminars are being held in four regions, including one in Grande Prairie at École Nouvelle Frontière on November 5. The two CSNO academic advisors agreed to offer a workshop.

**Human Resources** - CSNO is still looking for teachers at École Heritage and École Nouvelle Frontière. Substitutes are also being sought.
